Class Skill Support Report

After completing each Reading selection, students answer questions that require them to exercise various comprehension subskills. The comprehension subskills are contained within nine broader Anchor Skill categories. The Class Skill Support Report groups students who are struggling with the same comprehension subskills and links to Teaching Tools that can be used for remediation.

How are skills identified?

- Up to three subskills per student may be flagged for remediation. A subskill is flagged if:
 - The performance percentage is <60%, and
 - The student has been exposed to the subskill at least ten times on current and previous level combined.
- Skills are presented based on priority order; a more fundamental Anchor Skill is prioritized over a higher-order skill.
- For example: Anchor 1 would be prioritized over Anchor 2; subskill 3A would be prioritized over subskill 3B.
- Students working on Levels Pre-A, A, and HiA are not flagged for skill remediation. We recommend that students
- working on these lowest levels strengthen comprehension skill through extensive practice in the Reading component.
